

Scrappy

Scrappy is just that, a little stuffed friend made of your yarn scraps. She is even stuffed with little bits of yarn and dryer lint. So gauge isn't really that important.

Body

Follow charts below.

The body, head, ears, arms, and legs of scrappy are worked flat in multiple pieces.

Finishing.

Top stitch two eyes and a mouth on the face.

Sew the front and back pieces of the head together making sure that you leave an opening at the top to add the ears and bottom section to the head.

Fold each ear in half at the center point. Sew both side seams together and attach the bottom to the head.

Sew the front and back pieces of the body together, being sure to match the rows together, and leaving the bottom and top open.

Attach the head to the top of the body.

Fold the arms and leg pieces in half and close the bottom and side seams. Be sure to stuff each leg or arm before you close them at the top.

Attach the legs to the bottom of the body and close off the last stitches.

Stuff the rest of the body and close the top head stitches between the ears.

Take a long needle and thread and knot one end of the thread. Run the needle through the top of the arm, body, and second arm and tie off the thread on the opposite side. This will allow for moveable arms and give it a vintage look and touch.

Note: The front pieces are slightly larger on the ears and body to allow it to roll back on the edges slightly.



Size

Varies depending on yarn



Materials

- Scraps, anything you have around the house
- Filling: yarn, roving, dryer lint (scraps)
- US 6 / 4 mm or size to obtain Correct Gauge
- 1 Tapestry Needle


Gauge

20 stitches = 10.1 cm (4 inches) in stockinette Stitch










Needed:
